The Pittsburg County Sheriff's Foundation was established in January of 2017. Sheriff Chris Morris and several local businessmen got together to start this foundation to help purchase Deputies safety equipment they need to perform their job more safely and efficiently, so that we could provide this county with the best Law Enforcement it has ever seen. The county budget does not support many of the needs for Law Enforcement, such as equipment and training, so we had to come up with a way to purchase these Deputies the equipment they need and a way to get them the best training available. We also had to prioritize our needs, since there were so many tools and equipment needed. One of our main concerns, but biggest expense was communications. This includes radio's for vehicles and portable handheld radios. Radios are a huge safety issue, because our county is so big, and there are many areas where we had no coverage at all. Through fundraisers and many generous donors, the Foundation recently purchased 20 new Motorola car radios and 21 new Motorola mobile radios. Deputies can be heard loud and clear all over the county now, and are able to communicate with dispatch anytime when needed.

Sheriff Chris Morris and all of his Deputies, would like to thank the Sheriff's Foundation, retired board members, current board members and all of the generous donors that have stood beside us and helped us accomplish our mission over the past 3 years. Without your help and hard work, we wouldn't be where we are today. The Foundation has raised over \$200,000.00 to help purchase Deputies much needed safety equipment.

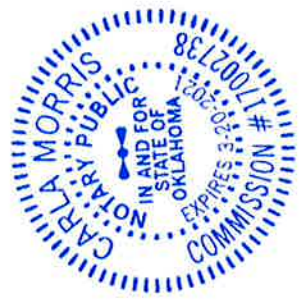

AMENDMENT

SECTION 125 FLEXIBLE BENEFIT PLAN

WHEREAS, Section XI of the Section 125 Flexible Benefit Plan (“Plan”) permits amendment to the Plan;

WHEREAS, the Employer desires to amend the Plan to include changes in the definition of medical expense related to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act);

NOW, THEREFORE, the Plan is hereby amended, effective April 15, 2020, or if later, upon execution of this amendment, as follows:

1.

Section 8.04 (a) is amended by removing that Section in its entirety and in its place including the following:

“(a) Eligible Medical Expense in General. The phrase ‘Eligible Medical Expense’ means any expense incurred by a Participant or any of his Dependents (subject to the restrictions in Sections 8.04(b) and (c)) during a Plan Year that (i) qualifies as an expense incurred by the Participant or Dependents for medical care as defined in Code Section 213(d) and meets the requirements outlined in Code Section 125, (ii) is excluded from gross income of the Participant under Code Section 105(b), and (iii) has not been and will not be paid or reimbursed by any other insurance plan, through damages, or from any other source. Notwithstanding the above, capital expenditures are not Eligible Medical Expenses under this Plan.

2.

Section 8.05 introductory language is amended by removing that portion of the Section in its entirety and in its place including the following:

“8.05 USE OF DEBIT CARD: In the event that the Employer elects to allow the use of debit cards (“Debit Cards”) for reimbursement of Eligible Medical Expenses under the Medical Expense Reimbursement Plan, the provisions described in this Section shall apply.”

This amendment is effective for medical expenses incurred after December 31, 2019

4.

Other than changes made herein, the Plan shall remain in full force and effect.

Participant memberships will be effective upon AirMedCare Network' receipt of (a) this Agreement signed by the Organization, (b) payment as provided above and (c) monthly employee census list completed by the Participants/Company. Memberships will automatically expire for an employee at the time they are no longer employed with the company. No refunds.
2. AirMedCare Network agrees that Participant Lists (a) will be used by AirMedCare Network only for the purpose of delivering AirMedCare Network services, (b) will be treated like any other AirMedCare Network confidential information and (c) will not be used, sold or shared with any third party inconsistent with this provision.
3. This membership plan will be effective for 12 months, effective as of 4/13/2020, and will be evaluated by both parties annually at least 30 days prior to anniversary date, if (a) no termination notice has been sent by either party and (b) payment for the renewal period is received by AirMedCare Network before expiration of the grace period. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time and for any reason with 30 days prior written notice to the other party, but termination will not affect issued memberships.





Terms and Conditions

AirMedCare Network is an alliance of affiliated air ambulance providers* (each a "Company"). An AirMedCare Network membership automatically enrolls you as a member in each Company's membership program. Membership ensures the patient will have no out-of-pocket flight expenses if flown by a Company by providing prepaid protection against a Company's air ambulance costs that are not covered by a member's insurance or other benefits or third party responsibility, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. Patient transport will be to the closest appropriate medical facility for medical conditions that are deemed by AMCN Provider attending medical professionals to be life- or limb-threatening, or that could lead to permanent disability, and which require emergency air ambulance transport. A patient's medical condition, not membership status, will dictate whether or not air transportation is appropriate and required. Under all circumstances, an AMCN Provider retains the sole right and responsibility to determine whether or not a patient is flown.
2. AMCN Provider air ambulance services may not be available when requested due to factors beyond its control, such as use of the appropriate aircraft by another patient or other circumstances governed by operational requirements or restrictions including, but not limited to, equipment manufacturer limitations, governmental regulations, maintenance requirements, patient condition, age or size, or weather conditions. FAA restrictions prohibit most AMCN Provider aircraft from flying in inclement weather conditions. The primary determinant of whether to accept a flight is always the safety of the patient and medical flight crews. Emergent ground ambulance transport of a member by an AMCN Provider will be covered under the same terms and conditions.
3. Members who have insurance or other benefits, or third party responsibility claims, that cover the cost of ambulance services are financially liable for the cost of AMCN Provider services up to the limit of any such available coverage. In return for payment of the membership fee, the AMCN Provider will consider its air ambulance costs that are not covered by any insurance, benefits or third party responsibility available to the member to have been fully prepaid. The AMCN Provider reserves the right to bill directly any appropriate insurance, benefits provider or third party for services rendered, and members authorize their insurers, benefits providers and responsible third parties to pay any covered amounts directly to the AMCN Provider. Members agree to remit to the AMCN Provider any payment received from insurance or benefit providers or any third party for air medical services provided by the AMCN Provider, not to exceed regular charges. Neither the Company nor AirMedCare Network is an insurance company. Membership is not an insurance policy and cannot be considered as a secondary insurance coverage or a supplement to any insurance coverage. **Neither the Company nor AirMedCare Network will be responsible for payment for services provided by another ambulance service.**
4. Membership starts 15 days after the Company receives a complete application with full payment; however, the waiting period will be waived for unforeseen events occurring during such time. Members must be natural persons. Memberships are non-refundable and non-transferable.
5. Some state laws prohibit Medicaid beneficiaries from being offered membership or being accepted into membership programs. By applying, members certify to the Company that they are not Medicaid beneficiaries.
6. These terms and conditions supersede all previous terms and conditions between a member and the Company or AirMedCare Network, including any other writings, or verbal representations, relating to the terms and conditions of membership.

Privacy Policy (Cont'd)



A. Sharing Information with NFP Affiliates

We may share information about you with other NFP affiliates, as permitted by law, in order to provide you with as many financial tools as possible. We may share identification information and transaction experience with other NFP affiliates. Our affiliates provide a wide range of financial services to meet your financial needs. Our affiliates include broker-dealers, investment advisors, financial planners and insurance brokers. We may share customer information so that they can tell you about services and products that may be of special interest or value to you.

We may share experience and non-experience nonpublic personal information about you to NFP's affiliates. Non-experience information is information such as income or marital status that is not related solely to transactions or other experiences with NFP. If you prefer that we do not disclose nonpublic personal information about you to our affiliates, you may opt out of those disclosures. That is, you may direct us not to make those disclosures (other than disclosures permitted by law). To opt out you may fill out and return the attached notification form.

B. Sharing Information With Third Parties Not Affiliated With NFP.

We disclose information with unaffiliated third parties as required or permitted by law. Please be assured that whatever the reason for sharing your personal information, we take steps to assure that those parties respect your privacy by limiting the use of the information to the purpose for which it was disclosed. These unaffiliated third parties may include:

- Companies that perform services to your account that we do not provide ourselves. Such services may include account valuation, preparation of account statements, determination of fees and printing services.
- Companies that will help protect your account from fraud.
- Companies that provide services necessary to effect a transaction that you request or to service your account.
- Government agencies, courts, parties to lawsuits, or regulators in response to subpoenas. In such cases, we share only the information that we are required or authorized to share.

III. Compensation

We engage in one or more lines of business, including corporate and executive benefits. We are typically compensated through fees and commissions for services provided to clients. In addition to the standard commissions received for the services provided to you, we or our affiliates may earn additional compensation for our role in providing certain products and services to you under separate contracts with insurance companies and group benefits providers. Insurance companies and group benefits providers may pay us or our affiliates contingent compensation upon satisfaction of factors such as volume, persistency or profitability of the business placed with such insurance company or group benefits provider. In addition, such product and service providers may pay us or our affiliates fixed amounts related to the support of company conferences, conventions and other marketing efforts.

IV. Confidentiality and Security

The security of your account information is important to us. Only those persons who need your information to perform their job have access to it. In addition, we maintain physical, electronic and procedural security measures that comply with federal regulations to protect your information.

Our employees have limited access to your personal information based upon their responsibilities. All employees are instructed to protect the confidentiality of your personal information as described in these policies, which are strictly enforced.

V. Former Customers

If you end your relationship with NFP, we will continue to adhere to the policies and practices described in this notice. We will also continue to respect any opt out election that you may have made.
