

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PROFESSIONAL LEGAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This is an agreement between the Board of County Commissioners for Pittsburg County, Oklahoma, and the County Assessor for Pittsburg County, Oklahoma, (both parties sometimes hereafter referred to as "CLIENTS") and Tisdal & O'Hara, PLLC, ("T&O") and is subject to approval by the District Attorney for Pittsburg County, Oklahoma.

1. CLIENTS have agreed, with the approval of the District Attorney, to employ T&O to represent the CLIENTS with regard to certain ad valorem tax issues ("Issues").

2. Where necessary, T&O shall appear as counsel, and may act on behalf of CLIENTS, or at the direction of CLIENTS, with regard to the Issues, including, without limitation, in any hearing, trial or appellate proceeding.

3. T&O shall be paid at the following hourly rates for work performed hereunder by personnel in Tisdal & O'Hara:

Partner	Up to \$275.00/hour
Associate	Up to \$175.00/hour
Paralegal/Legal Assistant	Up to \$60.00/hour

Such time shall be billed by T&O, and paid by CLIENTS, on a monthly basis.

4. CLIENTS will pay T&O for actual hours (or fractions) at the hourly rates above set forth. T&O will submit its bills for payment to County Commissioners for Pittsburg County, c/o Michelle Fields, County Assessor's Office, 115 East Carl Albert Parkway, McAlester, Oklahoma 74501.

5. CLIENTS shall be responsible for the employment of consultants, appraisers, or other such experts and for the payment of all third party costs and expenses related to the performance of this contract. To the extent that T&O advances such costs, T&O will be reimbursed therefor. Such costs and fees may be billed directly through this agreement.

6. CLIENTS may discharge T&O at any time without cause. In the event of discharge the CLIENTS will not be liable for any professional services or other charges after notice of discharge has been received by T&O, excepting only those subsequent services and charges, if any, provided at the request of CLIENTS which are involved in turning over the matter to successor counsel. In the event of discharge, T&O will submit a final bill within thirty days of notice of discharge.

7. The term of this contract shall be from January 21, 2020, through June 30, 2020. CLIENTS may, at their option, renew the contract with consent of the District Attorney.

8. T&O will furnish to CLIENTS a status report, as requested and as deemed appropriate and prudent by CLIENTS, to keep CLIENTS informed of developments on a timely basis.

9. T&O agrees, as part consideration for this contract, that its books, records, documents, accounting procedures, practices or any other items relevant to the performance of this agreement are subject to examination by CLIENTS upon request.


10. This agreement will be subordinate to the laws, court orders, policies, procedures and rules, existing and future, relative to the operation and management of the CLIENTS.

Circuit Engineering District Auction Policies

Counties voluntarily participate in the Circuit Engineering Districts Auctions. This facilitates disposing surplus equipment. These auctions bring larger numbers of potential bidders and is advertised nationwide. In order to meet bidders' expectations, the Oklahoma Cooperative Circuit Engineering Districts Board, OCCEDB, has implemented the following polices.

If the county consignor decides to remove equipment after the equipment has been submitted to the auctioneer and is printed on the auction brochure, a removal penalty will be charged. Removal penalty is 8% of the equipment value determined by OCCEDB, using industry standards such as "Machinery Trader" and/or "Last Bid".

Bidders are traveling long distances and expect the brochure equipment to be in the auction. This removal penalty will be paid to OCCEDB.

If a county decides to purchase its' piece(s) of equipment back, the county will still be required to pay the 8% commission fee (6% to the auctioneer and 2% to the CED).

If a county consignor feels that there are extenuating circumstances that affect the issues stated above, then the County Commissioner may come to an OCCEDB meeting to state his or her case.

All titled pieces of equipment must have their titles submitted in a timely manner so that the VIN and other information are matched to the equipment delivered.

Failure to comply with these policies could jeopardize the county's future participation in the CED auctions.



The Board of County Commissioners, Pittsburg County, met in regular session on Monday, January 27, 2020.

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Board of County Commissioners that the guidelines for Pittsburg County Volunteers should deviate from the guidelines for Pittsburg County employees where drug and alcohol testing is concern.

WHEREAS, it has been decided to draft a drug and alcohol testing policy which will apply only to Pittsburg County volunteers, including but not limited to volunteer firefighters, reserve deputy sheriffs and emergency management volunteers and any other volunteers that may fall under the jurisdiction of Pittsburg County.

WHEREAS, Pittsburg County has drafted the Pittsburg County Drug and Alcohol Testing Policy – Volunteers Edition. This draft has language that has come directly from the Pittsburg County Drug and Alcohol Testing Policy that covers all county employees. This new policy will become effective February 15, 2020.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of County Commissioners, Pittsburg County, do hereby approve the adoption of a drug and alcohol testing policy for volunteers, effective February 15, 2020.

PITTSBURG COUNTY DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING POLICY

VOLUNTEERS EDITION

PITTSBURG COUNTY IS A ZERO TOLERANCE COUNTY!

To enforce the policy against drugs and alcohol for all county volunteers, including all volunteer firefighters, all reserve sheriff deputies and all emergency management volunteers and to enforce the policy against county volunteers reporting for duty under the influence of illegal or abused drugs or alcohol. Pittsburg County will/may require an individual to undergo a test for drugs and/or alcohol under the following circumstances.

It is the County's intention to comply fully with the Oklahoma Statute on drug and alcohol testing, and the regulation of the U.S. Department of Transportation (49 CFR, Parts 40 and 382). In the event the State laws, State regulations or the DOT regulations are changed, this policy will be amended to reflect those changes and to remain consistent with State laws and regulations and DOT regulations. In such event, the County will notify all employees of these changes.

The paragraph below applies to all volunteers of Pittsburg County.

OKLAHOMA MARIJUANA USE, POSSESSION OR IMPAIRMENT POLICY FOR NON-CDL/CMV EMPLOYEES & VOLUNTEERS

County prohibits all Non-CDL/CMV employees and volunteers – including those with a valid Oklahoma medical marijuana license – from using or possessing marijuana while on County's premises or while performing duties as a Non-CDL/CMV employee or volunteer within Pittsburg County. This prohibition against marijuana use or possession applies to an of County's properties or work sites, including exterior areas, parking locations, personal vehicles or County vehicles and during any hours while performing duties as a Non-CDL/CMV employee or volunteer. The prohibition also applies to customer, client or other third-party locations or premises where a Non-CDL/CMV employee or volunteer is performing work or providing services. If a Non-CDL/CMV employee or volunteer's duties include transportation or travel, then the prohibition against marijuana use or possession applies to that transportation or travel time.

County prohibits all Non-CDL/CMV employee or volunteers – including those with a valid Oklahoma marijuana license – from being under the influence or impaired by marijuana during any hours while performing duties, regardless of location. A Non-CDL/CMV employee or volunteer is under the influence or impaired when marijuana use adversely affects ability to perform a job, interact with others, exercise judgment and/or work safely.

Violation of this Policy may result in discipline up to and including termination. If you have any questions about this Policy or its application please contact <u>Sandra</u> <u>Crenshaw</u>.

TESTING POLICY FOR VOLUNTEERS

1. Individual Subject to Drug and Alcohol Testing

All volunteers, applicants who have received a conditional offer of employment are subject to drug or alcohol testing and the provisions of this Policy.

- 2. <u>Applicant Testing</u>: Applicants who wish to become volunteer firefighters, reserve sheriff deputies or emergency management volunteers will be required to submit to drug and/or alcohol testing. A positive test or a refusal to undergo testing may result in a refusal to hire.
- 3. <u>For-Cause Testing</u>: Any time the County reasonably believes an individual is under the influence of drugs or alcohol, the County may require a drug or alcohol test. Circumstances causing the County to require testing of an individual may include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Drugs or alcohol on or about the individual's person or an individual's vicinity;
 - b. Conduct on the individual's part that suggests impairment or influence of drugs or alcohol;
 - c. A report of drug or alcohol use while on duty;
 - d. Information that an individual has tampered with drug or alcohol testing at any time; or
 - e. Negative performance patterns;

- 4. <u>Post-Accident Testing</u>: If a volunteer's conduct could have contributed to an accident while on duty which results in an injury to the employee or another person or damage to property, including damage to equipment, the employee may be required to undergo drug and/or alcohol testing. If the County conducts a post-accident test, the County will require employees whose conduct could have contributed to the accident to undergo a drug or alcohol test, whether or not they reported an injury.
- 5. <u>Return from Leave</u>: As required by the County in connection with a volunteer's return to duty from a leave of absence as part of the County's written policies.
- 6. <u>Positive Marijuana Test Results and Medical Marijuana Licenses</u>: Volunteers and applicants who test positive for marijuana or its components under this Policy will be required to establish they hold a valid Oklahoma medical marijuana license.
- 7. Substances Which May Be Tested

Under this Policy, the County shall test for drugs, including marijuana, and alcohol.

- 8. <u>Testing Methods and Collection Procedures</u>
 - a. Samples shall be collected and tested only by individuals deemed qualified by the State Department of Health and may be collected on the premises of the employer;
 - b. Only samples deemed appropriate by the State Department of Health for drug and alcohol testing shall be collected;
 - c. The collection of samples shall be performed under reasonable and sanitary conditions;
 - d. A sample shall be collected in sufficient quantity for splitting into two separate specimens, pursuant to rules of the State Board of Health, to provide for any subsequent independent analysis in the event of challenge of the test results of the main specimen;

- e. Samples shall be collected and tested with due regard to the privacy of the individual being tested. In the instances of urinalysis, no employer or representative, agent or designee of the employer shall directly observe an applicant or employee in the process of producing a urine sample; provided, however, collection shall be in a manner reasonably calculated to prevent substitutions or interference with the collection or testing of reliable samples;
- f. Sample collections shall be documented, and the documentation procedures shall include:
 - 1. Labeling of samples so as reasonably to preclude the probability of erroneous identification of test results, and
 - 2. An opportunity for the applicant or volunteer to provide notification of any information which the applicant or volunteer considers relevant to the test, including identification of currently or recently used prescriptions or non-prescription drugs, or other relevant information;
- g. Sample collection, storage, and transportation to the testing facility shall be performed so as reasonably to preclude the probability of sample contamination or adulteration;
- h. Sample testing shall conform to scientifically accepted analytical methods and procedures. Testing shall include confirmation of any positive test results by gas chromatography, gas chromatographymass spectroscopy, or an equivalent scientifically accepted method of equal or greater accuracy as approved by Board rule, at the cutoff levels as determined by Board rule, before the result of any test may be used as a basis for refusal to hire a job applicant or any action by an employer pursuant to 40 O.S. § 562 of this act;
- i. A written record of the chain of custody of the sample shall be maintained from the time of the collection of the sample until the sample is no longer required; and
- j. The County will use testing services and facilities which have been licensed by the State Department of Health to test for the presence of or abuse or drugs or alcohol.

9. <u>Records</u>

Records of all drug and alcohol test results and related information are the property of the County. However, upon written request, those feet results and related information will be made available for inspection and copying to the individual tested. The drug and alcohol test results and related information will be treated as confidential and will be maintained separate from other personnel records. Testing records may be provided to County employees, agents or representatives who need access to records in the administration of the Standards for Workplace Drug and Alcohol Testing Act. The Countymay share drug and alcohol test results and related information regarding employees of independent contractor or subcontractors with the respective independent contractor or subcontractor, as provided by the County's contractual agreement.

The volunteer grants permission to the County to release testing records and/or results for purposes of unemployment, Worker's Compensation and other employment-related legal actions. Additionally, testing records are admissible as evidence in a case or proceeding before a court of record or administrative agency if either the County or the individual tested are named parties in the case or proceeding. Further, testing records shall be released in order to comply with a valid judicial or administrative order.

The testing facility, or any agent, representative or designee of the facility, or any review officer, will not disclose to the County, based on the analysis or a sample collected from an individual under this Policy, any information relating to the general health, pregnancy or other physical or mental condition of the individual. The testing facility will release the results of the drug and alcohol test, and any analysis and information related thereto, to the individual testing upon request.

- 10. <u>Consequences for Violating the Testing Policy</u>
 - a. <u>Refusal to be Tested</u>: Any individual who refuses to submit to the County's request for drug and/or alcohol testing, or refuses to complete the required forms will be subject to termination from employment, or will not be eligible for employment, as the case may be. Interfering with and/or failing to cooperate with the testing process will be treated as refusal to be tested.
 - b. <u>Adulteration, Tampering or Manipulation of Samples</u>: The actual or attempted tampering, adulteration and/or manipulation of drug and alcohol testing samples is prohibited. Any individual who attempts to

alter, tamper or manipulate any testing samples will be subject to termination from employment, or will not be eligible for employment, as the case may be.

- c. <u>Personnel Action Which May Be Taken as a Result of Policy Violation</u> or a Positive Test Result:
 - 1. Any individual who violates this Policy regarding consumption, use, transfer, solicitation or sale of illegal drugs, illegal possession or inappropriate or moderate use of alcohol or the abuse of prescription or over-the-counter drugs will be subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to termination.
 - 2. Volunteers and applicants who test positive for marijuana or its components may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination under the County's Marijuana Use Possession or Impairment Policy.
 - 3. For volunteers and applicants with a valid Oklahoma medical marijuana license and who are not in safety-sensitive positions, no employment action will be based solely upon a positive test for marijuana components or metabolites.
 - 4. Safety-sensitive positions: Any applicants who apply for positions designated by the County as safety-sensitive are not eligible for hiring if they test positive for marijuana components or metabolites. Any volunteer who hold positions designated by the County as safety-sensitive are subject to discipline up to and including termination if they test positive for marijuana components or metabolites. These safety-sensitive prohibitions apply to applicants and volunteers who have valid Oklahoma medical marijuana licenses.

11. Confidential Explanation by Individual

Any individual who receives a positive drug test result or has otherwise violated this Policy will be given opportunity to offer an explanation, in confidence, to a representative of the County.

12. Appeal Procedures

Within 24 hours of receiving notice of a positive test, an individual may request a subsequent confirmation test of a sample. The individual shall pay all costs of the subsequent confirmation test, unless the subsequent confirmation test reverses the findings of the challenged positive test. In those cases where the confirmed test reverses the initial findings, the County will reimburse the individual for the cost of the subsequent confirmation test.

Any individual who is aggrieved by an alleged violation of the Oklahoma Standards for Workplace Drug and Alcohol Testing Act may file a civil action within one year of the alleged willful violation

13. Changes to this Policy

Any part of this Policy can be changed by the County with ten (10) days written notice.

If granted, this permit is subject to the following conditions, requirements and covenants, to-wit, please initial that you have read each condition, requirement or covenant:

1. Applicant/contractor is aware that all road crossing permits for PITTSBURG COUNTY shall require approval from the Pittsburg County Floodplain Administrator's Office and that all permits and fees owed to the Floodplain Administrator's Office will be paid in full before approval is given by the Board of County Commissioners.

2. Application for road crossing must be submitted *no later than 5 days before a meeting* of the Board of County Commissioners with a check for the amount of permit made payable to the Pittsburg County Commissioners. The petitioner/contractor <u>shall</u> contact the County Commissioners Office at the completion of crossing for an onsite inspection.

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- 3. The applicant must agree to hold Pittsburg County harmless for any damage or injury to persons or property caused by or resulting from the construction, maintenance, operation, or repair of the facilities on, under, or over the County right-of-way. The petitioner/contractor will be responsible for any damage resulting from deviation of the plat.
- 4. All crossings shall be bored on blacktop/asphalt roads. Cutting may be permitted on dirt roads, ditches, or other surfaces with approval from the Board of County Commissioners. Blasting is not permiteed.
- 5. In construction pipelines or utility routes that cross county highways or roads, NO DITCH, TRENCH, OR BORING, shall be done by the applicant/contractor until approved by the Board of County Commissioners. All ditching and trenching shall be completed to the County Commissioner's specifications. Applicants, contractors or owners shall maintain crossing. (Signs, grass, brush control, etc.)
- 6. The petitioner/contractor shall furnish all flag men, lights, barricades, and warning signs meeting all laws and regulations, including those in the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" appropriate for the construction project. The petitioner/contractor agrees to keep the road open to traffic unless approved by the Board of County Commissioners. At the conclusion of such work, the right-of-way must be in a presentable condition.
- 7. When notified to do so by the Board of County Commissioners, the petitioner/contractor agrees at their expense to make all changes in the facility on County right-of-way.
- 8. Relocation Applicant, upon 30 days written notice, agrees to relocate utilities at their expense should it interfere with County construction and/or maintenance.
- 9. Aerial facilities Clearance above the traffic lanes of the road at all aerial pole line crossings shall comply with applicable safety codes and will not be less than 20 feet. All poles, posts, stubs, fixtures, down guys, wires, and other appurtenances must be kept in good repair at all times and free from weeds and brush within a 5-foot area of the installation. These facilities, when paralleling the roadway, shall be single pole construction and located within 3 feet of the fence line, if a fence exists. If no fence exists, the right-ofway shall be located by an Oklahoma Registered Land Surveyor at the petitioner's expense and a copy provided to the Board prior to construction. All crossings shall be as nearly perpendicular as possible. Facility shall not interfere with the natural flow of waters or ditch.
- 10. Underground facilities All shall be a minimum of 5 feet below the elevation of the center line of the road, but not less than 4 feet fellow the bottom of the ditch. Crossings shall be encased from right-of-way line to right-of-way line and be vented off the right-of-way lines. Concrete caps of 4' wide and 6" deep may be required from edge of road to fence line. Identification markers shall be installed at each right-of-way line directly above the facility. The markers must identify the owner's name, address and telephone

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number, size of facility, and emergency contact number in black with a yellow background. Marker must be at least 130 sq. inches in area and erected at a height plainly visible from the road right-of-way.

All underground electric cable crossings must be placed in a conduit and be a minimum of 4 feet below the ditch flow lines. Conduit placed beneath a roadway must be steel, HDPE, heavy-duty PVC, or fiberglass if it is designed to withstand roadway loading and is properly protected.

Steel pipelines crossing the right-of-way may be, upon approve of the Commissioner, installed without encasement if the carrier pipe material within the right-of-way is superior to the carrier pipe material outside the right-of-way by being of steel at least one grade better and of the same wall thickness, or a minimum of one wall thickness greater and of the same alloy. Pipe must be properly protected from corrosion.

Facilities such as water and sanitary sewer lines crossing the county right-of-way shall be encased. Maintenance will be performed by a method that will not disturb the through lanes or interfere with traffic. All conduits shall be sufficient to withstand roadway loadings.

- 11. All section corners and ¼ section corners shall be protected. No pipeline or utility line shall cross an intersection diagonally. No liens shall cross within 50 feet of a ¼ section corner or 100' of a bridge.
- 12. Owners of all facilities shall be responsible, at their own expense, for decommissioning of sites. Roads and right-of-way shall be restored to the original condition or better.
- 13. All road crossings shall comply with all Department of Transportation and/or Oklahoma Corporation Commission pipeline safety standards rules and regulations in effect at the time of the permit.

14. All pipelines made of non-metallic materials must have a tracer wire installed so the pipeline can be located from above the ground.

15. Above ground water lines are temporary and shall be placed within three (3) feet of fence line or county right-of-way as not to disrupt road maintenance. All temporary water lines shall be marked or identified with a company contact number or sign at every county road crossing.

The type of temporary road crossing, either above the road surface or trenched, are at the discretion of the individual commissioner. Trenched lines shall be at sufficient depth as to not interfere with normal maintenance and shall be removed at applicant's expense. The owner, firm or company requesting the permit for temporary or permanent line(s) shall be responsible for all damages to county roads or right-of-way caused by such installation. Temporary installation permits are for a period of thirty (30) days. A new permit will be required for each thirty (30) day time period.

16. Any pipe or tinhorns to be installed shall be a beveled end at a 45° angle with concrete end treatments. The commissioner shall approve proper diameter of pipe.

All ditching and trenching shall be completed to the County Commissioner's specifications. Applicants, contractors or owners shall maintain crossing. (Signs, grass, brush control, etc.)
- 6. The petitioner/contractor shall furnish all flag men, lights, barricades, and warning signs meeting all laws and regulations, including those in the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices" appropriate for the construction project. The petitioner/contractor agrees to keep the road open to traffic unless approved by the Board of County Commissioners. At the conclusion of such work, the right-of-way must be in a presentable condition.
- 7. When notified to do so by the Board of County Commissioners, the petitioner/contractor agrees at their expense to make all changes in the facility on County right-of-way.
- 8. Relocation Applicant, upon 30 days written notice, agrees to relocate utilities at their expense should it interfere with County construction and/or maintenance.
- 9. Aerial facilities Clearance above the traffic lanes of the road at all aerial pole line crossings shall comply with applicable safety codes and will not be less than 20 feet. All poles, posts, stubs, fixtures, down guys, wires, and other appurtenances must be kept in good repair at all times and free from weeds and brush within a 5-foot area of the installation. These facilities, when paralleling the roadway, shall be single pole construction and located within 3 feet of the fence line, if a fence exists. If no fence exists, the right-ofway shall be located by an Oklahoma Registered Land Surveyor at the petitioner's expense and a copy provided to the Board prior to construction. All crossings shall be as nearly perpendicular as possible. Facility shall not interfere with the natural flow of waters or ditch.

number, size of facility, and emergency contact number in black with a yellow background. Marker must be at least 130 sq. inches in area and erected at a height plainly visible from the road right-of-way.

All underground electric cable crossings must be placed in a conduit and be a minimum of 4 feet below the ditch flow lines. Conduit placed beneath a roadway must be steel, HDPE, heavy-duty PVC, or fiberglass if it is designed to withstand roadway loading and is properly protected.

Steel pipelines crossing the right-of-way may be, upon approve of the Commissioner, installed without encasement if the carrier pipe material within the right-of-way is superior to the carrier pipe material outside the right-of-way by being of steel at least one grade better and of the same wall thickness, or a minimum of one wall thickness greater and of the same alloy. Pipe must be properly protected from corrosion.
