


RIVERINE FLOODING

A **watershed** is an area that drains into a lake, stream or other body of water. Other names for it are <u>basin</u> or <u>catchment area</u>.

Watersheds vary in size. Larger ones can be divided into sub-watersheds. The boundary of a watershed is a ridge or divide. Water from rain and snowmelt are collected by smaller channels (tributaries) which send the water to larger ones and eventually to the lowest body of water in the watershed (main channel).

<u>Channels</u> are defined features on the ground that carry water through and out of the watershed. They may be called rivers, creeks, streams or ditches. They can be wet all the time or dry most of the time.

When a channel receives too much water, the excess flows over its banks and into the adjacent floodplain. Flooding that occurs along a channel is called <u>riverine flooding</u>.



What happens in a watershed will affect events and conditions downstream. Terrain helps determine the dynamics of riverine flooding. In relatively flat areas, shallow, slow-moving floodwater may cover the land for days or even weeks.

In hilly and mountainous areas, a flood may come scant minutes after heavy rain. Such a flash flood gives short notice and moves so fast that it is particularly dangerous to people and property in its path.

the 1993 Mississippi River flood or hurricanes are in another category because such events build over several days, giving people enough time to evacuate safely.

- In 1972, 118 people died along Buffalo Creek in West Virginia when an embankment made of coal refuse washed out, destroying 546 houses and damaging many more.
- Weeks later, 236 people died when heavy rain and a dam failure inundated the area near Rapid City, South Dakota. Property damage exceeded \$100 million.
- In 1976, heavy rains spawned floods in Colorado's Big Thompson Canyon, killing 139 people.
- The next year, 77 people died in Johnstown, Pennsylvania, when heavy rain overwhelmed a dam, causing \$200 million in damage.

COASTAL FLOODING

Development along the coasts of the oceans, the Gulf of America, and large lakes can be exposed to two types of flood problems not found in riverine areas: coastal storms and coastal erosion. The pacific and Caribbean coasts face a third hazard: tsunamis.

Lake flooding

Lake shores can flood in ways similar to the ocean coasts. Along the Great Lakes severe storms can produce waves and cause shoreline erosion. FEMA is starting to map Great Lakes flooding with the same techniques it uses for ocean coastal flooding.

SHALLOW FLOODING

Shallow flooding occurs in flat areas where a lack of channels means water cannot drain easily. Shallow flood problems fall into three categories: sheet flow, ponding and urban drainage.

Sheet Flow

Where there are inadequate or no defined channels, floodwater spreads out over large areas at a somewhat uniform depth in what's called **sheet flow**.

Sheet flows occur after an intense or prolonged rainfall during which the rain cannot soak into the ground. During sheet flow, the floodwater moves downhill and covers a wide area.

Oklahoma enjoyed a mild and wet first half of summer through mid-July. Just four triple-digit temperatures had been recorded across the Oklahoma Mesonet's 120 sites through July 18. However, recent rains often pushed heat index values above the 100-degree mark in many areas. A good old-fashioned Oklahoma heat wave began on July 18, with triple-digit highs every day thereafter and heat index values soaring into dangerous territory. The month ended with 254 triple-digit temperatures recorded by the Mesonet, peaking at 106 degrees at Kingfisher on July 30. Factoring in Oklahoma's famous humidity, the Mesonet calculated 2,055 triple-digit heat index values during the month, including 876 that reached at least 105 degrees. The highest heat index reading was 114 degrees at Cherokee on July 21.

Drought Threatens Return During July

Drought, which had largely retreated from Oklahoma in June for the first time in nearly six years, began creeping back during July. An area of abnormal dryness (D0) was reintroduced in southwestern Oklahoma on the July 8 U.S. Drought Monitor map, initially covering just 1.24% of the state. That coverage grew to 4.73% by month's end. The Oklahoma Mesonet reported it had been as long as 35 days since parts of the southwest had received at least a quarter inch of rain in a day, with at least 19 dry days across a broad portion of the southeastern half of the state. Monthly rainfall deficits climbed to 1–3 inches across the southeast and 1–2 inches in the northwest. The statewide average precipitation finished at 2.64 inches—0.56 inches below normal—ranking as the 59th-driest July since records began in 1895. Forty-eight Mesonet sites recorded less than 2 inches during the month, including 16 with less than an inch. Antlers reported the highest July total with 12.11 inches.

2025 Tornado Count Creeps Up

There was only a single confirmed tornado in Oklahoma during July—right in line with the long-term July average of 1.6—but it pushed the year-to-date total well above the annual average of 59, reaching a preliminary count of 88 for the first seven months of the year. The January–July average is 51. Of those 88 tornadoes, two were rated EF3 on the Enhanced Fujita Scale, with three rated EF2, and 70 classified as either EF0 or EF1. Thirteen tornadoes were rated EFU, indicating unknown intensity. No EF4 or EF5 "violent" tornadoes had been confirmed in the state through the end of July 2025.




EUFO2: Eufaula Lake






What's the Difference Between a Flood Watch and a Flood Warning?



A flood/flash flood WATCH means a flood or flash flood is possible.



A flood/flash flood WARNING means flooding or flash flooding is already occurring or will occur soon. TAKE IMMEDIATE PRECAUTIONS!

Know the difference between WATCHES and WARNINGS

- A National Weather Service WATCH is a message indicating that conditions favor the occurrence of a certain type of hazardous weather. For example, a severe thunderstorm watch means that a severe thunderstorm is expected in the next six hours or so within an area approximately 120 to 150 miles wide and 300 to 400 miles long (36,000 to 60,000 square miles). The NWS Storm Prediction Center issues such watches. Local NWS forecast offices issue other watches (flash flood, winter weather, etc.) 12 to 36 hours in advance of a possible hazardous-weather or flooding event. Each local forecast office usually covers a state or a portion of a state
- An NWS WARNING indicates that a hazardous event is occurring or is imminent in about 30 minutes to an hour. Local NWS forecast offices issue warnings on a county-by-county basis.

Many more WATCHES are issued than WARNINGS. A WATCH is the first sign a flood may occur, and when one is issued, you should be aware of potential flood hazards.

Be aware of flood hazards. Floods can roll boulders, tear out trees, destroy buildings and bridges, and scour out new channels. Floodwaters can reach heights of 10 to 20 feet

The Oklahoma Legislature passed HB 2914 creating the Oklahoma Sheriff's Office Funding Assistance Grant Program within the Attorney General's office. The Attorney General is authorized pursuant to 74 O.S. § 20k-1A to establish the Grant Program for the purpose of "ensuring professional law enforcement throughout the state by providing financial assistance to sheriff's offices in qualified counties." Specifically, monies will be directed toward funding the lawful operations of the sheriff's office.

I. AVAILABLE FUNDS

Appropriations made available through legislation provide a funding stream. Funds made available through the Oklahoma Sheriff's Office Funding Assistance Grant Program shall be used to supplement, and not supplant, other federal, state, county, and local funds expended to carry out activities relating to the lawful operations of the sheriff's office. Grant funds are to be used to enhance the budget of the sheriff's office, not replace any funds allocated from the county.

II. PURPOSE AREA

To be eligible for a Sheriff's Office Funding Assistance Grant, a sheriff's office shall submit an application to the Office of the Attorney General along with a resolution signed and attested by the chair of the board of county commissioners approving the submission of the application. Grant awards are limited to the lawful operation of the sheriff's office. Awards shall not be used for the payment of salary. Grant funds are based on the gross assessed total tangible property valuation of the county, and will be awarded to qualified counties in the following amounts*:

- a. \$150,000 for the twenty-six (26) counties having the lowest gross assessed total tangible property valuation.
- b. \$250,000 for the twenty-six (26) counties ranked higher than the counties described in (a) but lower than the counties described in (c).
- c. \$300,000 for the twenty-five (25) counties having the highest gross assessed total tangible property valuation.

III. ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Awards will be made to qualified sheriff's offices across Oklahoma. A county must be the legal applicant and recipient of funds on behalf of a sheriff's department. It will be necessary to have an authorized official sign the grant application via a resolution. This can be found on the Attachments page of the application.

IV. REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPLICANTS

All applicants must submit a completed grant application, as well as a completed and signed resolution (to be uploaded to the application). Applicants MUST include in their application the operational expenses to be addressed by the funding. Salaries are not an allowable use of funds.

V. GRANT PERIOD

Funds for projects receiving approval will be dispersed upon the Attorney General's Office receipt of an invoice from the agency receiving the funds. Continued funding is not guaranteed. This grant is awarded on an advancement basis and not reimbursement. All funds must be expended by June 30, 2027.

VI. APPLICATION DEADLINE

The application must be submitted via OGX by August 31, 2025 at 11:59pm. Late applications will not be accepted.

VII. GRANT REVIEW / AWARD PROCESS

Funds will be awarded to qualified counties meeting application requirements. Awards will be based on the gross assessed total tangible property valuation of each county as outlined in 74 O.S. §20k-1A (D)(2). Upon approval of the grant application, staff will notify the successful applicant via OGX. Counties will be required to complete an agreement that sets forth the terms and conditions applicable to the grant prior to the distribution of funds.

Lease Purchase Agreement

This agreement is made this day of <u>August 18, 2025</u>, by and between the Board of County Commissioners of <u>Pittsburg</u> County, Oklahoma, designated as the Lessee and <u>YellowHouse Machinery Co</u>, designated throughout this agreement as the Lessor.

I. Equipment

Subject to the terms and conditions as set forth in this agreement, the Lessor leases to the Lessee the following described Equipment, all of which shall be designated throughout this instrument as the "Equipment":

II. Payment of Lease Purchase Installments

In consideration of the agreement by the Lessor to lease purchase the Equipment, the Lessee promises to pay the Lessor, for the equipment, the sum of <u>\$1,143.00</u> per month, (see enclosed payment schedule) during the term of this agreement or any renewal of the agreement.

III. Lease Term

This lease shall commence on the date the Equipment is accepted by the Lessee and shall automatically terminate, unless renewed in accordance with the terms set forth below, at the end of the fiscal year of the State of Oklahoma during which the lease is commenced.

IV. Option to Renew

The Lessee is hereby granted <u>2</u> successive options to renew this lease for additional terms not to exceed one fiscal year, plus one final option to renew this lease for a period of <u>2</u> months, all upon the same terms and conditions, provided that such options may be exercised, as a matter of right, solely and exclusively by the Lessee, the exercise of any such option shall be accomplished by the issuance of a purchase order upon or within thirty (30) days after the expiration of the terms of the lease or any renewal then in effect.

V. Title to Equipment

The Equipment is and shall at all times during the term of this lease and any renewal term remain the sole property of the Lessor and the Lessee shall have or acquire no right, or title to the Equipment until the final payment is made.

VI. Option to Purchase

In the event the lessee shall have exercised all of its options for renewal of this lease as provided in paragraph IV, above, upon tender of the last lease payment due under the last renewal term, the Lessee shall acquire title to and ownership of the Equipment. In the alternative, the Lessee, at its sole and exclusive option, may purchase the Equipment at any time during the term of this lease or during any renewal term as provided by paragraph IV, above, giving written notice to the Lessor or Lessee's intent to purchase accompanied by a single, final payment of the amount equal to the remaining unpaid principal and interest balance due under the terms of this agreement. (If purchase price is to be reduced by a percentage of the lease payments made prior to the exercise of the purchase option, describe fully, the manner in which such reduction shall be computed. Attach a written schedule of purchase option prices which shall be incorporated in the terms of this agreement by reference). In the event the Lessee shall exercise any option to purchase the Equipment, the Lessor assigns to the Lessee all rights and claims which the Lessor may have or acquire arising under antitrust laws of the United States or of any State regarding the Equipment purchased under the terms of his agreement.

VII. Delivery and Return of Equipment

The Lessor shall bear all costs of shipping and delivering the Equipment to the lessee. Installation costs, if any, shall be borne by the Lessor. The Equipment shall be delivered to or installed at the location designated by the Lessee.

VIII. Repairs and Maintenance

The Lessee shall maintain the Equipment in good working order and shall make all necessary routine adjustments and repairs, as a result of fair wear and tear, all at the expense of the Lessee. The Lessor and the Lessee may provide for the maintenance and repair of the Equipment by separate written agreement, and, in the event they make such agreement, its terms shall supersede and replace the provisions of this paragraph of this lease.

IX. Taxes

The Lessor shall forthwith pay all taxes which may be imposed upon it with the respect to the Equipment.

X. Insurance

The Lessee shall obtain and maintained fire and extended coverage casualty insurance covering the Equipment from time to time the Equipment is delivered until this lease is terminated. This insurance shall be in a form acceptable to the Lessor and shall insure the full value of the Equipment against the risk of loss or damage. The Lessee shall provide the Lessor with written notice at least ten days prior to any change in the insurance required under the terms of this paragraph.

XI. Patents

In the event any suit is instituted against the Lessee which is based upon any claim that any of the Equipment is implicated in an infringement of any provision of the United States Patent Law, the Lessor shall, at its own expense, defend such suit against the Lessee; provided, Lessee provides the Lessor with prompt notice of the institution of such suit and permits the Lessor to fully participate in the defense. The Lessee shall also retain the right to participate in such defense and shall, in any event, provide the Lessor with all available information, assistance and authority to enable the Lessor to conduct the defense. No compromise or settlement of such suit resulting in a judgement against the Lessee shall obligate or bind the Lessor unless the Lessor shall have accepted such compromise or settlement, the Lessor shall have the right to enter into negotiations for and effect a compromise or settlement of such patent action, but no such compromise or settlement shall be binding upon Lessee unless approved by Lessee. Subject only to the terms of this paragraph, the Lessor shall hold the Lessee harmless from any liability arising from any patent suit such as is described above. In the event any of the Equipment shall be held, in any suit, to constitute an infringement of patent law, and its use shall be enjoined, then the Lessor shall, at its sole option and the Lessor's expense:

- 1. Obtain for the Lessee the right to continue to use the Equipment;
- 2. Replace or modify the Equipment in a manner acceptable to the Lessee so that the Equipment no longer infringes any provision of patent law.

XII. Funding

Notwithstanding any other provision of this agreement, the parties acknowledge and agree that funds to be paid by the Lessee under the terms of this lease will be available only as appropriated on a fiscal year-to-fiscal year basis by properly constituted legal authority. In the event that the Lessee determines that sufficient funds have not be appropriated to make the payments required under the terms of the agreement, the obligations of the Lessee under this agreement shall terminate. In such event, the Lessee shall give prompt written notice of termination to the Lessor.

XIII. Assignment

The Lessor may, with the prior written approval of the Lessee, assign its right to receive payment of lease due under the terms of this agreement. However, any such assignment shall not relieve the Lessor of its responsibilities to perform the duties and obligations imposed upon it by this agreement.

XIV. Road Machinery and Equipment

If the terms of this agreement are in regard to the road machinery or equipment, the Lessee assumes all risk and liability for and shall hold the Lessor harmless from all damages to property and injuries and death to persons arising out of the use, possession, or transportation of said road machinery or equipment.

XV. Entire Agreement of the Parties and Severability

Except as otherwise provided in the above terms and conditions, this lease, together with applicable purchase orders and the invitation to bid, constitute the entire agreement of the parties. This agreement may not be modified or terminated except as provided in the above terms and conditions or by written agreement of the Lessor and the Lessee. If any provision of this agreement shall be determined to be invalid, it shall be considered as deleted from this agreement and no remaining provision of the agreement shall be deemed invalid.

XVI. Choice of Law

This lease shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of Oklahoma. In the event any litigation shall occur concerning the terms and conditions of this lease or the rights and duties of the parties, the parties agree that any such suit shall be maintained in the District Court in and for the <u>Pittsburg</u> County, State of Oklahoma.

Department of the Treasury Internal Revenue Service Center Ogden, UT 84201

Private delivery services (PDS). You can use certain PDS designated by the IRS to meet the "timely mailing as timely filing/paying" rule for tax returns and payments. These PDS include only the following:

- DHL Express (DHL): DHL Same Day Service.
- Federal Express (FedEx): FedEx Priority Overnight, FedEx Standard Overnight, FedEx 2Day, FedEx International Priority, and FedEx International First.
- United Parcel Service (UPS): UPS Next Day Air, UPS Next Day Air Saver, UPS 2nd Day Air, UPS 2nd Day Air A.M., UPS Worldwide Express Plus, and UPS Worldwide Express.

The PDS can tell you how to get written proof of the mailing date.

Other Forms That May Be Required

For rebating arbitrage (or paying a penalty in lieu of arbitrage rebate) to the federal government, use Form 8038-T, Arbitrage Rebate, Yield Reduction and Penalty in Lieu of Arbitrage Rebate. For private activity bonds, use Form 8038, Information Return for Tax-Exempt Private Activity Bond Issues.

For a tax-exempt governmental obligation with an issue price of \$100,000 or more, use Form 8038-G.

Rounding to Whole Dollars

You may show the money items on this return as whole-dollar amounts. To do so, drop any amount less than 50 cents and increase any amount from 50 to 99 cents to the next higher dollar. For example, \$1.49 becomes \$1 and \$2.50 becomes \$3. If two or more amounts must be added to figure the amount to enter on a line, include cents when adding the amounts and round off only the total.

Definitions

Obligations. This refers to a single taxexempt governmental obligation if Form 8038-GC is used for separate reporting or to multiple tax-exempt governmental obligations if the form is used for consolidated reporting.

Tax-exempt obligation. This is any obligation including a bond, installment purchase agreement, or financial lease on which the interest is excluded from income under section 103.

Tax-exempt governmental obligation. A tax-exempt obligation that isn't a private activity bond (see below) is a tax-exempt governmental obligation. This includes a bond issued by a qualified volunteer fire department under section 150(e).

Private activity bond. This includes an obligation issued as part of an issue in which:

- More than 10% of the proceeds are to be used for any private activity business use, and
- More than 10% of the payment of principal or interest of the issue is either (a) secured by an interest in property to be used for a private business use (or payments for such property) or (b) to be derived from payments for property (or borrowed money) used for a private business use.

It also includes a bond, the proceeds of which (a) are to be used to make or finance loans (other than loans described in section 141(c)(2)) to persons other than governmental units and (b) exceeds the lesser of 5% of the proceeds or \$5 million.

Issue. Generally, obligations are treated as part of the same issue only if they are issued by the same issuer, on the same date, and as part of a single transaction, or a series of related transactions. However, obligations issued during the same calendar year (a) under a loan agreement under which amounts are to be advanced periodically (a "drawdown loan") or (b) with a term not exceeding 270 days, may be treated as part of the same issue if the obligations are equally and ratably secured under a single indenture or loan agreement and are issued under a common financing arrangement (for example, under the same official statement periodically updated to reflect changing factual circumstances). Also, for obligations issued under a drawdown loan that meets the requirements of the preceding sentence, obligations issued during different calendar years may be treated as part of the same issue if all of the amounts to be advanced under the draw-down loan are reasonably expected to be advanced within 3 vears of the date of issue of the first obligation. Likewise, obligations (other than private activity bonds) issued under a single agreement that is in the form of a lease or Installment sale may be treated as part of the same issue if all of the property covered by that agreement is reasonably expected to be delivered within 3 years of the date of issue of the first obligation.

Arbitrage rebate. Generally, interest on a state or local bond isn't tax-exempt unless the issuer of the bond rebates to the United States arbitrage profits earned from investing proceeds of the bond in higher yielding nonpurpose investments. See section 148(f).

Construction issue. This is an issue of taxexempt bonds that meets both of the following conditions:

- 1. At least 75% of the available construction proceeds of the issue are to be used for construction expenditures with respect to property to be owned by a governmental unit or a 501(c)(3) organization, and
- 2. All of the bonds that are part of the issue are qualified 501(c)(3) bonds, bonds that aren't private activity bonds, or private activity bonds issued to finance property to be owned by a governmental unit or a 501(c)(3) organization.

In lieu of rebating any arbitrage that may be owed to the United States, the issuer of a construction issue may make an irrevocable election to pay a penalty. The penalty is equal to 1-1/2% of the amount of construction proceeds that do not meet certain spending requirements. See section 148(f)(4)(C) and the Instructions for Form 8038-T.

Specific Instructions

In general, a Form 8038-GC must be completed on the basis of available information and reasonable expectations as of the date of issue. However, forms that are filed on a consolidated basis may be completed on the basis of information readily available to the issuer at the close of the calendar year to which the form relates, supplemented by estimates made in good faith.

Part I—Reporting Authority

Amended return. An issuer may file an amended return to change or add to the information reported on a previously filed return for the same date of issue. If you are filing to correct errors or change a previously filed return, check the *Amended Return* box in the heading of the form.

The amended return must provide all the information reported on the original return, in addition to the new corrected information. Attach an explanation of the reason for the amended return and write across the top "Amended Return Explanation."

Line 1. The issuer's name is the name of the entity issuing the obligations, not the name of the entity receiving the benefit of the financing. In the case of a lease or installment sale, the issuer is the lessee or purchaser.

Line 2. An issuer that doesn't have an employer identification number (EIN) should apply for one online by visiting the IRS website at www.irs.gov/EIN. The organization may also apply for an EIN by faxing or mailing Form SS-4 to the IRS.

Lines 3 and 4. Enter the issuer's address or the address of the designated contact person listed on line 6. If the issuer wishes to use its own address and the issuer receives its mail in care of a third party authorized representative (such as an accountant or attorney), enter on the street address line "C/O" followed by the third party's name and street address or P.O. box. Include the suite, room, or other unit number after the street address. If the post office doesn't deliver

mail to the street address and the issuer has a P.O. box, show the box number instead of the street address. If a change in address occurs after the return is filed, use Form 8822, Change of Address, to notify the IRS of the new address.

Note: The address entered on lines 3 and 4 is the address the IRS will use for all written communications regarding the processing of this return, including any notices. By authorizing a person other than an authorized officer or other employee of the issuer to communicate with the IRS and whom the IRS may contact about this return, the issuer authorizes the IRS to communicate directly with the individual listed on line 6, whose address is entered on lines 3 and 4 and consents to disclose the issuer's return information to that individual, as necessary, to process this return.

Line 5. This line is for IRS use only. Don't make any entries in this box.

Part II—Description of Obligations

Check the appropriate box designating this as a return on a single issue basis or a consolidated return basis.

Line 8a. The issue price of obligations is generally determined under Regulations section 1.148-1(b). Thus, when issued for cash, the issue price is the price at which a substantial amount of the obligations are sold to the public. To determine the issue price of an obligation issued for property, see sections 1273 and 1274 and the related regulations.

Line 8b. For a single issue, enter the date of issue (for example, 03/15/2020 for a single issue issued on March 15, 2020), generally the date on which the issuer physically exchanges the bonds that are part of the issue for the underwriter's (or other purchaser's) funds; for a lease or installment sale, enter the date interest starts to accrue. For issues reported on a consolidated basis, enter the first day of the calendar year during which the obligations were issued (for example, for calendar year 2020, enter 01/01/2020).

Lines 9a through 9h. Complete this section if property other than cash is exchanged for the obligation, for example, acquiring a police car, a fire truck, or telephone equipment through a series of monthly payments. (This type of obligation is sometimes referred to as a "municipal lease.") Also, complete this section if real property is directly acquired in exchange for an obligation to make periodic payments of interest and principal.

Don't complete lines 9a through 9d if the proceeds of an obligation are received in the form of cash even if the term "lease" is used in the title of the issue. For lines 9a through 9d, enter the amount on the appropriate line that represents a lease or installment

purchase. For line 9d, enter the type of item that is leased. For lines 9e through 9h, enter the amount on the appropriate line that represents a bank loan. For line 9h, enter the type of bank loan.

Lines 9i and 9j. For line 9i, enter the amount of the proceeds that will be used to pay principal, interest, or call premium on any other issue of bonds, including proceeds that will be used to fund an escrow account for this purpose. Several lines may apply to a particular obligation. For example, report on lines 9i and 9j obligations used to refund prior issues which represent loans from the proceeds of another tax-exempt obligation.

Line 9k. Enter on line 9k the amount on line 8a that doesn't represent an obligation described on lines 9a through 9j.

Line 10. Check this box if the issuer has designated any issue as a "small issuer exception" under section 265(b)(3)(B)(i)(III).

Line 11. Check this box if the issue is a construction issue and an irrevocable election to pay a penalty in lieu of arbitrage rebate has been made on or before the date the bonds were issued. The penalty is payable with a Form 8038-T for each 6-month period after the date the bonds are issued. Don't make any payment of penalty in lieu of rebate with Form 8038-GC. See Rev. Proc. 92-22, 1992-1 C.B. 736, for rules regarding the "election document."

Line 12. Enter the name of the vendor or bank who is a party to the installment purchase agreement, loan, or financial lease. If there are multiple vendors or banks, the issuer should attach a schedule.

Line 13. Enter the employer identification number of the vendor or bank who is a party to the installment purchase agreement, loan, or financial lease. If there are multiple vendors or banks, the issuer should attach a schedule.

Signature and Consent

An authorized representative of the issuer must sign Form 8038-GC and any applicable certification. Also, write the name and title of the person signing Form 8038-GC. The authorized representative of the issuer signing this form must have the authority to consent to the disclosure of the issuer's return information, as necessary to process this return, to the person(s) that has been designated in this form.

Note: If the issuer authorizes on line 6 the IRS to communicate with a person other than an officer or other employee of the issuer (such authorization shall include contact both in writing regardless of the address entered on lines 3 and 4, and by telephone), by signing this form, the issuer's authorized representative consents to the disclosure of the issuer's return information, as necessary to process this return, to such person.

Paid Preparer

If an authorized representative of the issuer filled in its return, the paid preparer's space should remain blank. Anyone who prepares the return but does not charge the organization shouldn't sign the return. Certain others who prepare the return shouldn't sign. For example, a regular, full-time employee of the issuer, such as a clerk, secretary, etc., shouldn't sign.

Generally, anyone who is paid to prepare a return must sign it and fill in the other blanks in the *Paid Preparer Use Only* area of the return. A paid preparer cannot use a social security number in the *Paid Preparer Use Only* box. The paid preparer must use a preparer tax identification number (PTIN). If the paid preparer is self-employed, the preparer should enter his or her address in the box.

The paid preparer must:

- Sign the return in the space provided for the preparer's signature, and
- Give a copy of the return to the issuer.

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

A. Reporting Entity

Pittsburg County is a subdivision of the State of Oklahoma created by the Oklahoma Constitution and regulated by Oklahoma Statutes.

the county's general operating fund, accounting for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund, where its use is restricted for a specified purpose. Other funds balances of the total of all funds under the control of the primary government. The general fund is The accompanying financial statement presents the receipts, disbursements, and changes in cash established by statute and under the control of the primary government are also presented. The County Treasurer collects and remits material amounts of intergovernmental revenues and ad valorem tax revenue for other budgetary entities, including libraries, school districts, and cities and towns. The cash receipts and disbursements attributable to those other entities do not appear in funds on the County's financial statement; those funds play no part in the County's operations. Any trust or agency funds maintained by the County are not included in this presentation.

B. Fund Accounting

The County uses funds to report on receipts, disbursements, and changes in cash balances. Fund accounting is designed to demonstrate legal compliance and to aid financial management by segregating transactions related to certain government functions or activities.

Following are descriptions of the county funds included within the financial statement:

County General - accounts for revenue derived mostly from ad valorem tax as directed by the Oklahoma Constitution and state statutes. Other revenue includes fees, in-lieu taxes, and other miscellaneous collections. Disbursements are for general operations of the County. County Highway Unrestricted - accounts for revenue from motor fuel and motor vehicle taxes and is designated for those activities associated with building and maintaining county roads and bridges.

constructing and County Bridge and Road Improvement - accounts for collections from fuel and gas taxes collected disbursements are for the purpose of by Oklahoma Tax Commission and maintaining county bridges and roads. 911 Phone Fees - accounts for fees collected by phone service providers in accordance with state statute to support 911 emergency operations.

Assessor Revolving Fee – accounts for the collection of fees for copies as restricted by state statute.

County Clerk Lien Fee - accounts for revenue generated from filing and copy fees. Proceeds to be expended as restricted by state statute.

instruments filed in the County Clerk's office. Expenditures are restricted to activities related to preservation of records in the County Clerk's office. County Clerk Records Management and Preservation Fund - accounts for fees collected for

The notes to the financial statement are an integral part of this statement.

Court Clerk Payroll - accounts for funds from the Court Fund for compensation of the District Court

Emergency Management - accounts for revenue from state or federal grants for the purpose of providing the County emergency management services.

Floodplain - accounts for fees collected from flood plain permits and map charges to offset the costs of floodplain management.

Health - accounts for ad valorem tax collections and fees for services collected, disbursements are for the operation of the County Health Department. Juvenile Detention - accounts for contractual revenue or grant funds for employing a director and deputies of county juvenile facilities.

emergency planning committees in the development of an emergency plan in accordance with the Local Emergency Planning Committee - accounts for legislative appropriations to assist local requirements of Title III of the Federal Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act.

as well as proceeds of selling real property in the County which has remained delinquent in ad valorem tax payments for three years. The fund is utilized by the County Treasurer for offsetting the Resale Property -- accounts for interest and penalties assessed on delinquent ad valorem tax payments costs associated with the collection of delinquent ad valorem taxes.

C. Basis of Accounting

The financial statement is prepared on a basis of accounting wherein amounts are recognized when received or disbursed. This basis of accounting differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP), which require revenues to be recognized when they become available and measurable or when they are earned, and expenditures or expenses to be recognized when the related liabilities are incurred. This regulatory basis financial presentation is not a comprehensive measure of economic condition or changes therein.

However, the County has elected to present all funds included in the audit in the Statement of Receipts, Disbursements, and U.S. GAAP or on a regulatory basis. The County has elected to present their financial statement on Title 19 O.S. § 171 allows Oklahoma counties to present their financial statement in accordance with Changes in Cash Balances-Regulatory Basis.

D. Budget

funds required to adopt a formal budget. On or before the first Monday in July of each year, each officer or department head submits an estimate of needs to the governing body. The budget is approved for the respective fund by office, or department and object. The County Board of Commissioners may approve changes of appropriations within the fund by office or department and Under current Oklahoma Statutes, a general fund and a county health department fund are the only object. To increase or decrease the budget by fund requires approval by the County Excise Board.

E. Cash

For the purposes of financial reporting, "Ending Cash Balances, June 30" includes cash and cash equivalents as allowed by statutes. The County pools the cash of its various funds in maintaining its bank accounts. However, cash applicable to a particular fund is readily identifiable on the County's books. The balance in the pooled cash accounts is available to meet current operating requirements. State statutes require financial institutions with which the County maintains funds to deposit collateral securities to secure the County's deposits. The amount of collateral securities to be pledged is established by the County Treasurer; this amount must be at least the amount of the deposit to be secured, less the amount insured (by, for example, the FDIC).

The County Treasurer has been authorized by the County's governing board to make investments. Allowable investments are outlined in statutes 62 O.S. § 348.1 and § 348.3.

All investments must be backed by the full faith and credit of the United States Government, the Oklahoma State Government, fully collateralized, or fully insured. All investments as classified by state statute are nonnegotiable certificates of deposit. Nonnegotiable certificates of deposit are not subject to interest rate risk or credit risk.

2. Ad Valorem Tax

The County's property tax is levied each October 1 on the assessed value listed as of January 1 of the same year for all real and personal property located in the County, except certain exempt property. Assessed values are established by the County Assessor within the prescribed guidelines established by the Oklahoma Tax Commission and the State Equalization Board. Title 68 O.S. § 2820.A. states, ... Each assessor shall thereafter maintain an active and systematic program of visual inspection on a continuous basis and shall establish an inspection schedule which will result in the individual visual inspection of all taxable property within the county at least once each four (4) years."
