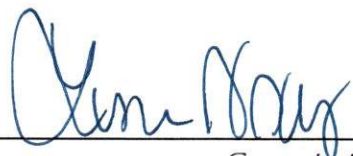

July Begins with Destructive Winds, Ends in a Heat Wave

Published: Monday, August 3, 2026

Mother Nature supplied fireworks of her own on July 4 as a destructive windstorm swept across Oklahoma, with Norman hardest hit. The month closed under a punishing heat wave, with widespread triple-digit temperatures during its final third. Between those dramatic bookends, rainfall fell short across most of the state and drought coverage held nearly steady at about 44%, setting the stage for heightened drought concerns in August.

Independence Day storms batter Oklahoma

A powerful complex of thunderstorms swept through Oklahoma late on July 4, producing widespread destructive straight-line winds. Norman took the brunt of the storm, with measured wind gusts reaching 92 mph at Max Westheimer Airport and 90.5 mph at the Norman Mesonet site shortly after 10 p.m. The Mesonet gust ranked 41st on the network's all-time list, which dates to 1994. The severity of the damage suggested localized winds may have exceeded 100 mph. Trees were uprooted or snapped, power poles and lines were toppled, homes and other structures were damaged, and a tractor-trailer was blown onto its side.

Norman was not the only area hit hard. Earlier that evening, severe storms swept across northeastern Oklahoma, damaging trees and utility infrastructure around Tulsa, Nowata and Bartlesville. At the height of the outages, approximately 95,000 customers were

without power statewide. PSO reported a peak of 24,522 customers without power, while OG&E and electric cooperatives also reported widespread outages across their service territories. OG&E alone reported 44 downed poles in Norman, while OEC reported snapped poles and extensive damage to electric and fiber infrastructure across Cleveland County.

Drought coverage holds steady despite hot, dry July

July brought widespread heat and rainfall deficits to Oklahoma. The statewide average temperature finished at 83.9°F, 2°F above normal, ranking as the 20th warmest July since records began in 1895. The statewide average rainfall total was 1.64 inches, 1.56 inches below normal, ranking as the 30th-driest July on record. Most of the state received below-normal rainfall, with the largest deficits across western and northern Oklahoma. Scattered portions of central and eastern Oklahoma benefited from heavier totals.

The heat became especially intense during the final third of the month, when triple-digit temperatures spread across much of the state. On July 21, Okmulgee's heat index reached 125.2°F, the sixth-highest daily maximum in Mesonet records dating to 1997. The reading resulted from an air temperature of 95.3°F and a dew point of 84.6°F, the fifth-highest dew point recorded by the network. Six days later, Hooker reached 111°F for the month's highest air temperature. Despite the heat and meager rainfall, drought coverage remained virtually unchanged at about 44%. Localized improvements and degradations largely offset one another, leaving the statewide drought statistics in an unusual midsummer stalemate.

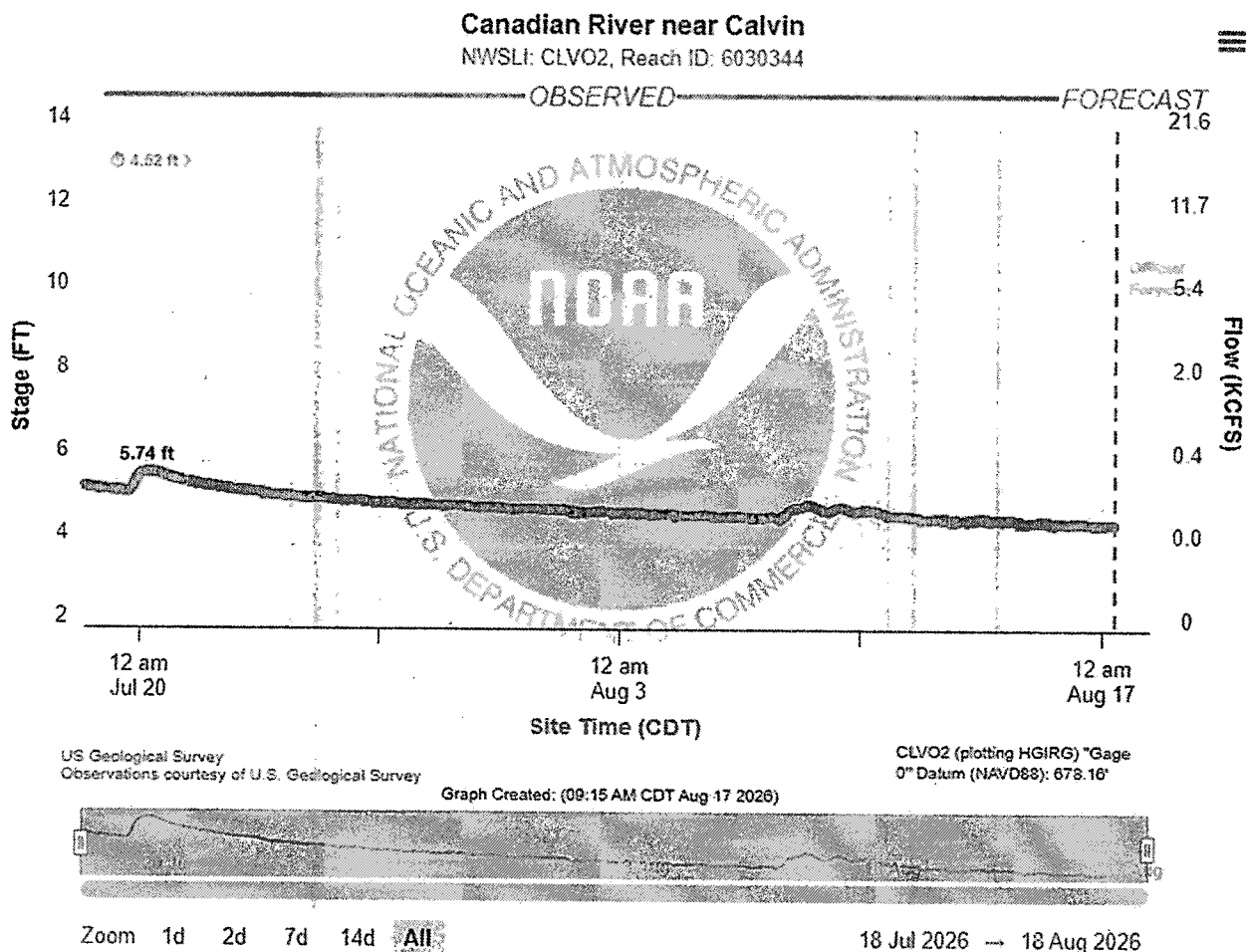

August outlook raises flash drought concerns

The Climate Prediction Center's August outlook favors above-normal temperatures across Oklahoma and below-normal precipitation across much of the Southern Plains, a combination that raises the threat of rapidly worsening drought conditions. CPC's monthly drought outlook calls for drought to persist where it already exists and for rapid drought development across all areas of Oklahoma not already in drought, citing growing 30- to 60-day rainfall deficits and rapidly declining soil moisture. The concern extends into mid-August, with CPC's Week 2 hazards outlook highlighting parts of Oklahoma and the surrounding Southern Plains for rapid-onset drought as continued heat and dryness increase evaporative demand.

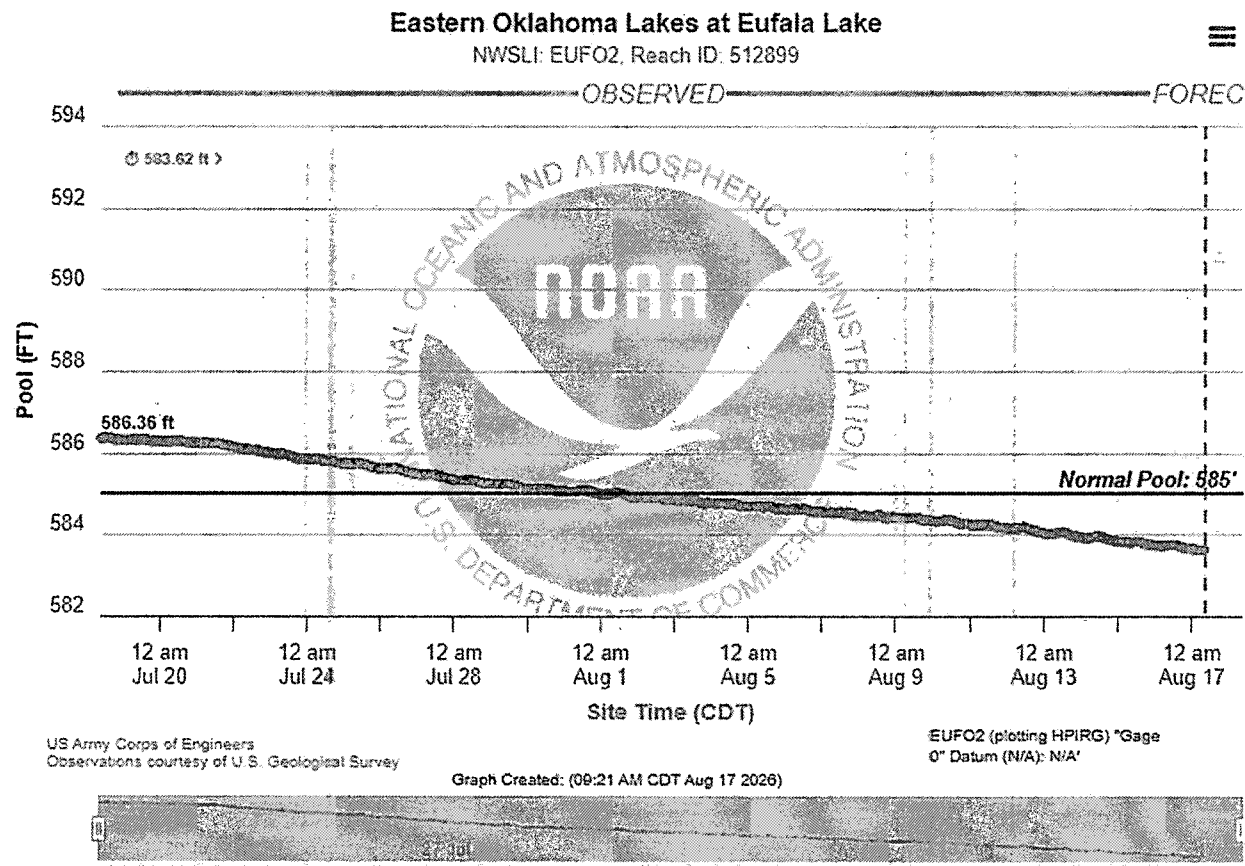

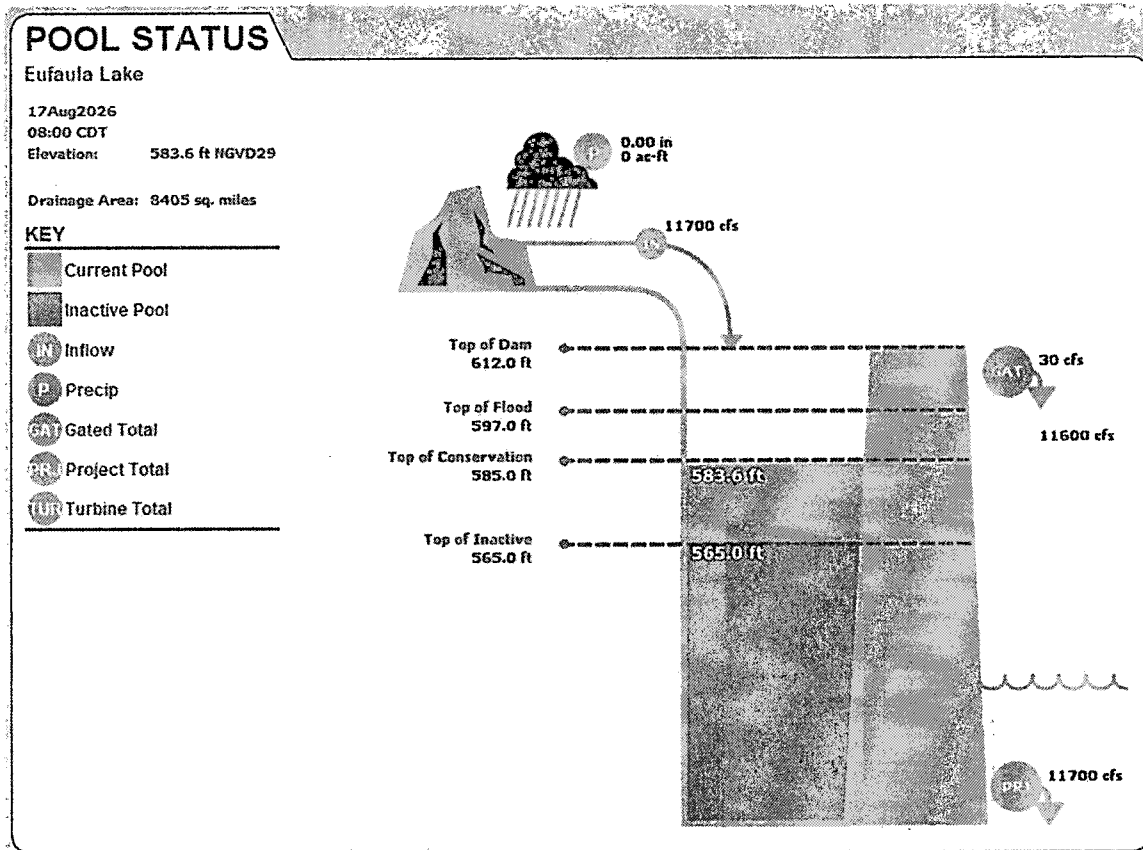

Current Conditions for Pittsburg County



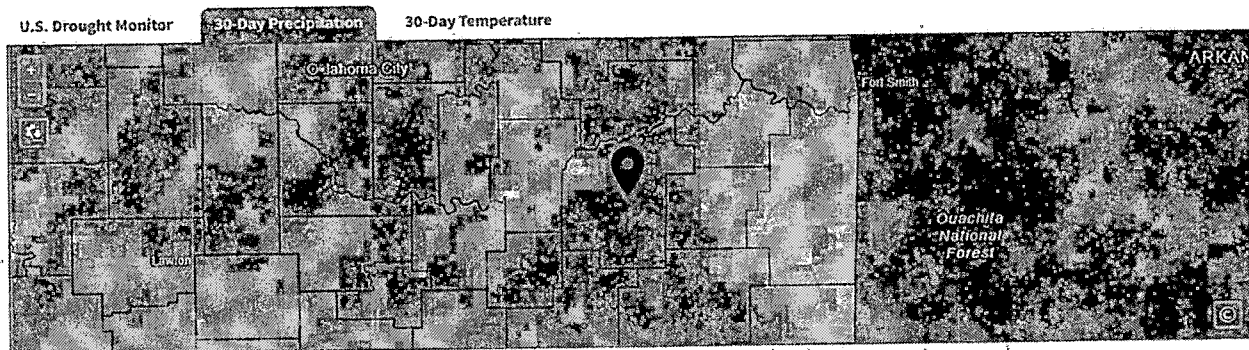

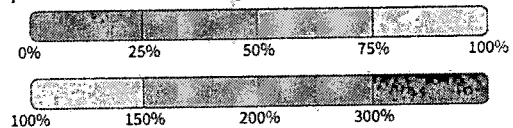

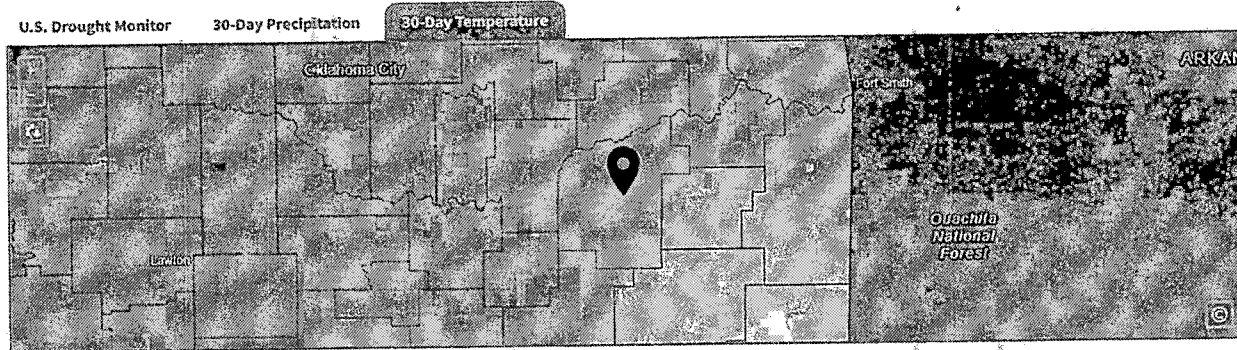

PAST 30 DAYS TEMPERATURE

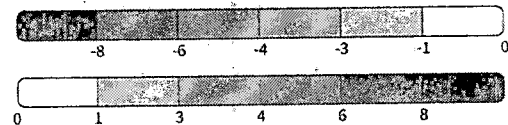

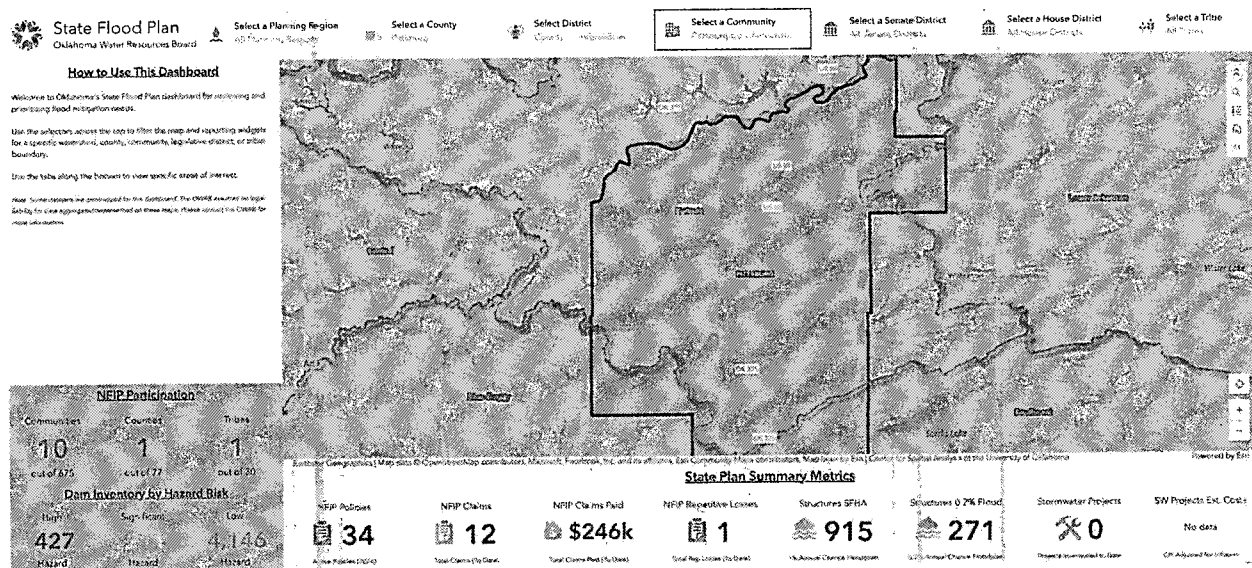
Departure from Normal Max Temperature (°F)

The Effects of Droughts: Why Floods Follow Periods of Drought

Earth's natural process of moving, distributing, and managing water is quite an incredible phenomenon. In the hydrologic spectrum, droughts and floods represent two extreme ends – however, the effects of droughts and floods are frequently interlinked. Many are often surprised to learn that [floods follow periods of drought](#).

Understanding this relationship and other effects of droughts is crucial for communities as we navigate the challenges posed by these natural events.

The Mechanics of Drought and Flood Cycles

To grasp why floods often succeed droughts, it is important to examine the mechanisms driving both conditions:

- **Drought** – A prolonged period of deficient rainfall. The top effects of droughts are dry soil, reduced water levels in rivers, lakes, and reservoirs, and stressed vegetation.
- **Flooding** – An overflow of water onto normally dry land, often due to heavy rainfall, rising sea levels, storms, rapid snowmelt, dam failure, and more.

How Drought Sets the Stage for Flooding

Soil Hydrology and Absorption:

- **Compacted Soil** – During extended droughts, soil becomes hard and compacted. This reduces its ability to absorb water when it rains, increasing runoff and the likelihood of flooding.
- **Hydrophobic Soil** – Prolonged dry conditions can make the soil hydrophobic, meaning it repels water. When rain finally falls, it tends to flow over the surface rather than soaking in, leading to rapid accumulation and potential flash flooding.

Vegetation and Ground Cover:

- **Vegetation Loss** – The effects of droughts stress out vegetation and can kill or severely weaken plants and trees, which play a critical role in stabilizing the soil and

absorbing water. Without this vegetation, there is less interception and absorption of rainwater, contributing to higher runoff and erosion.

- **Wildfires** – Droughts often increase the risk of wildfires, which can strip the land of vegetation and create a layer of ash and charred soil that is less permeable. This condition exacerbates runoff during subsequent rains.

River and Stream Response:

- **Reduced Channel Capacity** – Extended periods of low flow during droughts can lead to sediment buildup in rivers and streams. When heavy rains occur, these waterways may lack the capacity to handle the increased volume, leading to overflow and flooding.
- **Flash Floods** – Parched riverbeds and dry stream channels are less able to absorb sudden surges of water, leading to rapid rises in water levels and flash flooding, particularly in arid and semi-arid regions.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

A. Reporting Entity

Pittsburg County is a subdivision of the State of Oklahoma created by the Oklahoma Constitution and regulated by Oklahoma Statutes.

The accompanying financial statement presents the receipts, disbursements, and changes in cash balances of the total of all funds under the control of the primary government. The general fund is the county's general operating fund, accounting for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund, where its use is restricted for a specified purpose. Other funds established by statute and under the control of the primary government are also presented.

The County Treasurer collects and remits material amounts of intergovernmental revenues and ad valorem tax revenue for other budgetary entities, including libraries, school districts, and cities and towns. The cash receipts and disbursements attributable to those other entities do not appear in funds on the County's financial statement; those funds play no part in the County's operations. Any trust or agency funds maintained by the County are not included in this presentation.

B. Fund Accounting

The County uses funds to report on receipts, disbursements, and changes in cash balances. Fund accounting is designed to demonstrate legal compliance and to aid financial management by segregating transactions related to certain government functions or activities.

Following are descriptions of the county funds included within the financial statement:

County General – accounts for revenue derived mostly from ad valorem tax as directed by the Oklahoma Constitution and state statutes. Other revenue includes fees, in-lieu taxes, and other miscellaneous collections. Disbursements are for general operations of the County.

County Highway Unrestricted – accounts for revenue from motor fuel and motor vehicle taxes and is designated for those activities associated with building and maintaining county roads and bridges.

County Bridge and Road Improvement – accounts for collections from fuel and gas taxes collected by Oklahoma Tax Commission and disbursements are for the purpose of constructing and maintaining county bridges and roads.

911 Phone Fees – accounts for fees collected by phone service providers in accordance with state statute to support 911 emergency operations.

Assessor Revolving Fee – accounts for the collection of fees for copies as restricted by state statute.

County Clerk Lien Fee – accounts for revenue generated from filing and copy fees. Proceeds to be expended as restricted by state statute.

County Clerk Records Management and Preservation Fund – accounts for fees collected for instruments filed in the County Clerk's office. Expenditures are restricted to activities related to preservation of records in the County Clerk's office.

Court Clerk Payroll – accounts for funds from the Court Fund for compensation of the District Court employees.

Emergency Management – accounts for revenue from state or federal grants for the purpose of providing the County emergency management services.

Floodplain – accounts for fees collected from flood plain permits and map charges to offset the costs of floodplain management.

Health – accounts for ad valorem tax collections and fees for services collected, disbursements are for the operation of the County Health Department.

Juvenile Detention – accounts for contractual revenue or grant funds for employing a director and deputies of county juvenile facilities.

Local Emergency Planning Committee – accounts for legislative appropriations to assist local emergency planning committees in the development of an emergency plan in accordance with the requirements of Title III of the Federal Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act.

Resale Property – accounts for interest and penalties assessed on delinquent ad valorem tax payments as well as proceeds of selling real property in the County which has remained delinquent in ad valorem tax payments for three years. The fund is utilized by the County Treasurer for offsetting the costs associated with the collection of delinquent ad valorem taxes.

Reward Fund – accounts for revenue provided by fines assessed upon persons convicted of illegal dumping of trash, debris, waste, or other substances that may cause fire on public or private property. The Board of County Commissioners may use this fund to offer and pay a reward to individuals offering information that leads to an arrest and conviction. The fund may also be used for special enforcement programs related to investigating and/or preventing littering and illegal dumping.

Sheriff Commissary – accounts for profits on commissary sales in the County jail. Disbursements are for jail operations as defined by state statute.

Sheriff Forfeiture – accounts for proceeds from the sale of property seized by law enforcement as ordered by the court. The fund is used for law enforcement purposes and/or drug prevention and eradication.

Sheriff Service Fee – accounts for the collection of fees and reimbursements for revenues such as process fees, courthouse security, contracts for housing and feeding prisoners, and disbursements as restricted by state statute.

Sheriff Training – accounts for property in the possession of the Sheriff's office that remains unclaimed for a period of six months or more may be sold upon application to the district court. Proceeds are used for purchase of equipment, materials, or supplies that may be used in crime prevention, education, training, or programming.

Treasurer Mortgage Certification – accounts for fees collected by the County Treasurer for evaluating mortgages or other liens upon real property filed with the county for the purpose of collateralizing debt. The fund is used for lawful operation of the County Treasurer's office.

Drug Court – accounts for the collection of state receipts and fees and disbursed for the operation of the Drug Court program.

County Donations – accounts for donations to the county from private donors to be disbursed for a specified purpose and approved Board of County Commissioners' resolution.

Lake Patrol – accounts for revenue from contracts with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for law enforcement coverage on the lakes.

Equitable Sharing-DOJ – accounts for monies received from federal grants and disbursed for law enforcement purposes.

Opioid Abatement Settlement – accounts for court settlement from class-action lawsuits against opioid manufacturers and distributors. Proceeds to be used in accordance with the settlement agreement for opioid abatement.

Highway-ST- accounts for the collection of sales tax revenue and the disbursement of funds as restricted by the sales tax resolution.

Jail-ST- accounts for the collection of sales tax revenue and the disbursement of funds as restricted by the sales tax resolution.

Animal-ST- accounts for the collection of sales tax revenue and the disbursement of funds as restricted by the sales tax resolution.

Rural Fire-ST- accounts for the collection of sales tax revenue and the disbursement of funds as restricted by the sales tax resolution.

Rural Economic Action Plan Revolving Fund – accounts for revenue from the State of Oklahoma for the purpose of economic development.

Safe Oklahoma - AG – accounts for grant funds from the State of Oklahoma and disbursements are for salaries and operations of the Sheriff's office.

COVID Aid and Relief – accounts for federal grant monies received from the Coronavirus Relief Fund for the reimbursement of COVID related expenditures. Disbursements are for any lawful purpose of the County as directed by Board of County Commissioners' resolution.

American Rescue Plan Act 2021 – accounts for monies received from the United States Department of Treasury and disbursed for responding to the COVID-19 public health emergency and its negative economic impact, premium pay to eligible workers, the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19 public health emergency, and investments in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure as restricted by federal requirements.

Sheriff Funding Assistance – accounts for state monies received from the Oklahoma Sheriff's Office Funding Assistance Grant Program within the Oklahoma Attorney General's Office and disbursements are to be directed toward funding the lawful operations of the Sheriff's Office.

County Sinking Fund – accounts for the debt service collections derived generally from a special ad valorem tax levy and interest earned on investments.

C. Basis of Accounting

The financial statement is prepared on a basis of accounting wherein amounts are recognized when received or disbursed. This basis of accounting differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP), which require revenues to be recognized when they become available and measurable or when they are earned, and expenditures or expenses to be recognized when the related liabilities are incurred. This regulatory basis financial presentation is not a comprehensive measure of economic condition or changes therein.

Title 19 O.S. § 171 allows Oklahoma counties to present their financial statement in accordance with U.S. GAAP or on a regulatory basis. The County has elected to present their financial statement on a regulatory basis in conformity with Title 19 O.S. § 171, which specifies the format and presentation of such regulatory basis financial statements: county governments (primary only) are required to present their financial statements on a fund basis format with, at a minimum, the general fund and all other county funds, which represent ten percent or greater of total county revenue with all other funds included in the audit presented in the aggregate in a combining statement. However, the County has elected to present all funds included in the audit in the Statement of Receipts, Disbursements, and Changes in Cash Balances—Regulatory Basis.

D. Budget

Under current Oklahoma Statutes, a general fund and a county health department fund are the only funds required to adopt a formal budget. On or before the first Monday in July of each year, each officer or department head submits an estimate of needs to the governing body. The budget is approved for the respective fund by office, or department and object. The County Board of Commissioners may approve changes of appropriations within the fund by office or department and object. To increase or decrease the budget by fund requires approval by the County Excise Board.

E. Cash

For the purposes of financial reporting, "Ending Cash Balances, June 30" includes cash and cash equivalents as allowed by statutes. The County pools the cash of its various funds in maintaining its bank accounts. However, cash applicable to a particular fund is readily identifiable on the County's books. The balance in the pooled cash accounts is available to meet current operating requirements.

State statutes require financial institutions with which the County maintains funds to deposit collateral securities to secure the County's deposits. The amount of collateral securities to be pledged is established by the County Treasurer; this amount must be at least the amount of the deposit to be secured, less the amount insured (by, for example, the FDIC).

The County Treasurer has been authorized by the County's governing board to make investments. Allowable investments are outlined in statutes 62 O.S. § 348.1 and § 348.3.

All investments must be backed by the full faith and credit of the United States Government, the Oklahoma State Government, fully collateralized, or fully insured. All investments as classified by state statute are nonnegotiable certificates of deposit. Nonnegotiable certificates of deposit are not subject to interest rate risk or credit risk.

2. Ad Valorem Tax

The County's property tax is levied each October 1 on the assessed value listed as of January 1 of the same year for all real and personal property located in the County, except certain exempt property. Assessed values are established by the County Assessor within the prescribed guidelines established by the Oklahoma Tax Commission and the State Equalization Board. Title 68 O.S. § 2820.A. states, ". . . Each assessor shall thereafter maintain an active and systematic program of visual inspection on a continuous basis and shall establish an inspection schedule which will result in the individual visual inspection of all taxable property within the county at least once each four (4) years."

Taxes are due on November 1 following the levy date, although they may be paid in two equal installments. If the first half is paid prior to January 1, the second half is not delinquent until April 1. The County Treasurer, according to the law, shall give notice of delinquent taxes and special assessments by publication once a week for two consecutive weeks at any time after April 1, but prior to the end of September following the year the taxes were first due and payable. Unpaid real property taxes become a lien upon said property after the treasurer has perfected the lien by public notice.

Unpaid delinquent personal property taxes are usually published in May. If the taxes are not paid within 30 days from publication, they shall be placed on the personal tax lien docket.

3. Other Information

A. Pension Plan

Plan Description. The County contributes to the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement Plan (the Plan), a cost-sharing, multiple-employer defined benefit pension plan administered by the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System (OPERS). Benefit provisions are established and amended by the Oklahoma Legislature. The Plan provides retirement, disability, and death benefits to Plan members and beneficiaries. Title 74, Sections 901 through 943, as amended, establishes the provisions of the Plan. OPERS issues a publicly available financial report that includes financial statements and supplementary information. That report may be obtained by writing OPERS, P.O. Box 53007, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105 or by calling 1-800-733-9008.

Funding Policy. The contribution rates for each member category are established by the Oklahoma Legislature and are based on an actuarial calculation which is performed to determine the adequacy of contribution rates.

B. Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB)

In addition to the pension benefits described in the Pension Plan note, OPERS provides post-retirement health care benefits of up to \$105 each for retirees who are members of an eligible group plan. These benefits are funded on a pay-as-you-go basis as part of the overall retirement benefit. OPEB expenditure and participant information is available for the state as a whole; however, information specific to the County is not available nor can it be reasonably estimated.

C. Contingent Liabilities

Amounts received or receivable from grantor agencies are subject to audit and adjustment by grantor agencies, primarily the federal government. Any disallowed claims, including amounts already collected, may constitute a liability of the applicable fund. The amount, if any, of expenditures which may be disallowed by the grantor cannot be determined at this time; however, the County expects such amounts, if any, to be immaterial.

As of the end of the fiscal year, there were no claims or judgments that would have a material adverse effect on the financial condition of the County; however, the outcome of any lawsuit would not be determinable.

D. Sales Tax

The voters of Pittsburg County approved three quarters of one percent (3/4%) sales tax effective October 1, 2005. This sales tax was designated as follows:

- 48% constructing, renovating, expanding, equipping, which includes three-sixteenths of one cent for operating and maintaining the Pittsburg County Jail;
- 47% acquisition of real property, constructing, renovating, expanding, and furnishing the Pittsburg County Courthouse;
- 5% acquisition of real property, constructing, equipping, which includes one-sixteenth of one cent primarily for operating and maintaining a new Pittsburg County animal shelter.

A portion of this sales tax, one-half of one cent, expires October 1, 2024, or until principal and interest upon indebtedness is paid in full, whichever occurs earlier. On July 23, 2015, the Economic Development Authority, (the "Authority"), defeased all outstanding sales tax revenue bonds associated with one-half cent (.50%) associated with capital improvements. Therefore, one-half cent (.50%) county sales tax was terminated effective October 1, 2015. The remaining one quarter

sales tax is permanent. These funds are accounted for in Jail Maintenance and Operation, and Animal Shelter Maintenance and Operation funds.

The voters of Pittsburg County approved a permanent one quarter of one percent (1/4%) sales tax effective July 29, 2008. This sales tax was designated for fire protection. The sales tax will be distributed to the fire departments in the following communities; Alderson, Arrowhead Estates, Ashland, Blanco, Blue, Bugtussle, Canadian, Canadian Shores, Crowder, Elm Point, Haileyville, Hartshorne, Haywood-Arpelar, High Hill, Highway 9, Indianola, Kiowa, Krebs, McAlester, Pittsburg, Quinton, Sam's Point, Savanna, Shady Grove, Tannehill, and Union Chappell, or others hereinafter established. These funds are accounted for in the County Fire Tax fund.

The voters of Pittsburg County approved a permanent one percent (1%) sales tax effective January 1, 2016. The sales tax was designated for construction and repair of county roads and bridges; acquisition of equipment and materials; contractor services as necessary; and not for salaries of county employees; authorizing the pledging of said sales tax for debt service; making provisions separable; and declaring an emergency. These funds are accounted for in the Highway Sales Tax fund.

E. Tax Abatements

The County is subject to ad valorem tax abatements granted by the State of Oklahoma in accordance with the Oklahoma Constitution, Article 10 Section 6B for qualifying manufacturing concern—ad valorem tax exemption.

Under this program, a five-year ad valorem tax exemption exempts all real and personal property that is necessary for the manufacturing of a product and facilities engaged in research and development which meet the requirements set by the Oklahoma Constitution and statutes. Under Title 68 O.S. § 2902, in exchange for the five-year exemption, qualifying manufacturing concerns must meet certain minimum investment requirements for construction, acquisition, or expansion of a manufacturing facility. In addition, there are general minimum payroll requirements that must be met and the qualifying manufacturing concern must offer basic health benefit plans to all full-time employees within 180 days of employment.

The County had \$ 22,244.00 of ad valorem taxes abated under this program for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2026.

The State has an Ad Valorem Reimbursement Fund in accordance with Title 62 O.S. § 193 that is used to reimburse the County for the loss of revenue. Monies apportioned to this fund by the State also may be transferred to other state funds or otherwise expended as directed by the Legislature. In the event monies apportioned to the Fund are insufficient to pay all claims for reimbursement, claims for reimbursement for loss of revenue due to manufacturing exemptions of ad valorem taxes
